DEPARTMENT TRAINING

Beyond the impact of COVID-19 in 2020, we were able to get back to in person Fire and EMS training while still utilizing safe practices.

In 2021 Zeeland Township Fire Department was offered the use of two acquired structures to train with. Both were residential housing structures that were slated to be demolished. Before they were demolished for future growth by the owners, the fire department was able to setup valuable live action training inside the homes on multiple occasions. Zeeland Township Firefighters continually work to enhance methods and skills used on fire scenes. Having structures to practice these technical skills in helps firefighters refine them even further, paving the way for smooth and quick operation on fire scenes.

NEW RECRUITTRAINING

Zeeland Township Fire Department had two new recruits graduate the Ottawa County Fire Academy in 2021. The two new recruits also completed National and State required Medical First Responder training.

INVESTING IN FUTURE LEADERS

Two firefighters furthered their individual training by attending Fire Officer classes. Both Firefighters graduated the Fire Officer 1 program and now have some of the required prerequisites needed for potential future promotion.

STATE FIRE INSTRUCTORS

Acombination of current Zeeland Township Firefighters and Fire Officers furtherd their individual training by attending Fire Officer classes. 5 attendees of the State Certified Instructor Course have graduated and are now following up with their mentored instructing hours to become State Fire Instructors.












RESPONSES BY YEAR







RESPONSES BY CALL TYPE







RESPONSES BY MONTH






RESPONSES BY DAY OF WEEK






RESPONSES BY TIME OF DAY





RESPONSES MAPPED





OPERATIONS



January 30

Chicago Dr Fire: Fire Departmentunits were dispatched to a commercial building that witnesses saw flames and smoke billowing from. Firefighters arrived to find a commercial building fully engulfed in flames. Crews fought the fire defensively and utilized Aerial 642 to apply water on the fire from above.



February I

64th Ave & Riley St: Firefighters arrived to find a vehicle that had crashed through trees and brush well off the roadway, down into a embankment. The handicap driver in the vehicle was pinned-in. Crews rapidly deployed their specialized electric extrication equipment and freed the driver. Additional crews used the heavy duty winch system on Engine 623 and rescue ropes to employ a low angle rescue setup to bring the patient out of the ravine safely.





March 12



March 16

Chicago Dr. & 56th Ave: Fire
Department units were dispatched to a rollover vehicle accident with the single occupant driver pinned-in. Units arrived to find a full size pickup truck resting on it side. The occupant of the vehicle was injured and fire department medics determined he had priority injuries. Crews used technical vehicle stabilization devices to secure the vehicle from further movement. Firefighters used specialized electric extrication equipment and freed the driver, who was transported to the hospital.

72nd Ave Fire: Firefighters responded to flames showing from the garage area of a two-story residence on 72nd Ave. The fire had originated in the garage and was spreading to a breeze way that lead into the house. One resident was inside the home when the fire started. Crews conducted an offensive fireattack and quicklystopped the fire from spreading and extinguished the fire.





June 28

Jamestown Assist: Fire Department units were dispatched to assist Jamestown Fire Department on a vehicle accident involving a loaded gravel semi. Zeeland Township Fire units were able to providemanpower and our specialized extrication equipment to free the driver and stabilize the scene. The driver was transported to the hospital.



July 7

Allegan Sheriff Drone Call: Zeeland Township Drone Team was called out to assist the Allegan Sheriff's department for the search of a lost scuba diver. The scuba diverwas hired to inspect the dam. The diver was reported missing and the search began. The diverwas later found deceased.





August 20

Ransom St Fire: Zeeland Township Fire crews responded to a reported house fire at a residence on Ransom St. First arriving crews found a room and contents fire in a bedroom off the rear of the home. An initial entry crew was able to extinguish the fire before it spread to any other part of the home. One resident was present at the time of the fire, but was able to exit the home and call 911 withno injuries.



August 31

Chemical Spill: Zeeland Township UTV and Drone Team were called out to assist neighboring agencies on a large chemical release in Zeeland City. The Township Drone was used to get an overhead aerial view of the spill to evaluate the size of the chemical release. The UTV was used to transport the HazMat crews over the area where road vehicles could not travel, such as down the train tracks and through off road terrain.





October 10

Jamestown Barn Fire: Zeeland Township Fire assisted Jamestown Fire Department on a well involved barn fire. Fire crews assisted in providing personnel at the scene and equipment. Firefighters worked efficiently to keep additional structures from also catching fire. Crews fought the fire defensively and had it under control within a short time. No injuries were reported.



October 19

Felch St. Fire: Fire crews responded to a reported commercial Fire at the Hospital. Engine 623 was the first arriving crew and made entry and quickly identified a room and contents fire in the basement. The fire protection systems had contained the fire to a single room. Crews were able to mitigate furtherfire loss. No injuries were reported.





October 21

Car vs. Building: Fire crews responded to a vehicle that had collided with a building at the hospital. Arriving crews found the structure significantly damaged from the incident. Upon impact to the building, hospital staff came to the aid of the driver and brought him into the hospital.



December 2

Ransom St. Fire: Zeeland Township Fire units responded to an agricultural fire inside of a grain bin. Arriving crews setup ladder operations from Aerial 642. Crews conducted a transitional attack, initially applying water from the exterior and then wereable to move inside a column in the bin and remove the section of grain that was burning. Firefighters contained the fire to its location of origin and prevented other structures from burning.



















